## Board Update /2023-2024 SY Vote- Kellie Peek

## **Grade Presentation** – Kindergarten

- Jennifer Walton and Sandi Coulter utilized Antelope Trails School assessment circle graphs from beginning of the school year to mid-year assessments.
- Kindergarten had six students in the "red" zone at the beginning of the year, considered to be below benchmark rank.
- At midyear there are zero kids in the red and no other students have dipped below their beginning of year benchmark, majority have improved.
- These assessments results are due to the assistance of all paraprofessionals, the intervention team, teachers and parent volunteers.
- Mrs. McManus has brough in Secret Stories for Kindergarten to pull IB learning through word association.
